Join a Creative Problem Solving Team!

Students in grades K-5 are invited to participate in Destination Imagination. Destination Imagination is an international program that encourages creative problem solving. Students will learn how to tap into their own creativity, how to solve problems, and how to work together in teams.

Teams of up to seven members choose one challenge and spend several months perfecting their "solution" for the tournament. Being a part of a DI team requires a commitment from the students as well as their parents. Students must attend team practices and parents will be asked to provide snacks, volunteer in some way, and provide transportation for their child. Weekly practices are usually held after school or on the weekend.

The DI teams will present their solution to their challenge at the county tournament on March 4, 2023. If the team qualifies they will be asked to present their solution at the state tournament in April.

<u>In order to provide this wonderful experience for our children we need parents to serve as Team Managers</u>. Team Managers are needed to lead each team of seven. The manager is responsible for meeting with the team at least once a week. It is their job to guide and support the students. Team managers must also commit to being at the county, state, and Global (if qualified) competitions.
