Please make sure that your student is coming to school with a mask each day as well as extras. Often, masks break, especially the disposable ones, leaving students without them. Thank you for your support!



GIFTED EDUCATION SCREENING PROCESS

Charles County Public Schools has adjusted the gifted education screening process for the 2021-2022 school year. The following is the timeline for gifted screening and Cognitive Abilities (CogAT) Testing.

- Gifted Screening and Identification for current 2nd grade students All 2nd grade students will be given the Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT) January/February 2022 as part of the global screening process for gifted identification. Gifted screening will take place May 2022 and students identified will begin services 2022-2023 school year. Parents will receive notification with their child's screening results June 2022.
- Gifted Screening and Identification, current 3rd grade students 2021-2022 All 3rd grade students will be given the CogAT test November/December 2021, and gifted screening will take place prior to second semester. Third grade students identified will begin services January/February 2022. Parents will receive notification with their child's screening results January/February 2022.
- Gifted Screening and Identification, new to CCPS & referred 4th-7th grade students— CogAT will
 be administered November/December 2021 to all new to CCPS and referred students. Gifted
 screening will take place May 2022 and students identified will begin services 2022-2023 school
 year. Parents will receive notification with their child's screening results June 2022.

The Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT) is used as one of several screening tools to identify students in need of gifted education services. The CogAT is used nationally, as well as by several Maryland counties, as a tool in the identification of academically gifted students. It has been found to be especially helpful in finding students who may not show up on measures of academic achievement alone. Students are assessed in reasoning and problem solving abilities. These abilities are assessed on three subtests using words (verbal subtest), numerical concepts (quantitative subtest), and spatial/figural drawings (nonverbal subtest).

Based on *CogAT* scores, your child may be identified to be screened for gifted services. You will receive notification if your child is being screened and you will be asked to offer parent input into the process. Parents may also nominate their child to be screened for gifted services. Parent nomination forms are available for downloading from the CCPS website at http://www.ccboe.com/index.php/gifted-education-services or you may request a form directly from the school. Nomination forms are due by November 1st.

Matula Elementary Pumpkin Decorating Challenge!



Dear Families,

This year, the library is getting into the fall spirit by having a pumpkin decorating contest. Matula Dolphins are invited to decorate a pumpkin like their favorite book character. It's easy and fun for the whole family! Students may bring in a decorated pumpkin to the school library and enter it into our contest <u>anytime between</u> October 18th-22nd. All entries must be received by 10:00 a.m. the morning of October 22nd.

Contest Rules:

- 1. <u>ABSOLUTELY NO CARVED PUMPKINS!</u> Carved pumpkins rot, attract bugs, and smell. Most importantly, we don't want a child handling a knife or carving tools. Carved pumpkins will not be entered into the contest and will be sent home. Pumpkins may be painted, hot glued, colored, etc.
- 2. Pumpkins should represent a favorite book character. The entry form needs to be completed in full in order for your pumpkin to be entered into the challenge.
- 3. This is a family project and a great opportunity to spend some quality time together being creative. The more detailed and creative the pumpkins, the better! But please, make sure the children are doing the majority of the work, with your assistance. Siblings may work together to submit one pumpkin, if they like.
- 4. **Do not** write your name anywhere on the pumpkin. When you bring your pumpkin and entry form to Mrs. Koch, she will record the information so that each pumpkin can be properly identified.
- 5. Students will be able to vote for their favorite pumpkins during their library time. The 3 pumpkins that receive the most votes will win a \$10 book fair coupon to be used in our Fall Book Fair, coming in December. Winners will be announced October 29, 2021.
- 6. If you'd like to send in the copy of the book that goes along with your book character pumpkin, we would love to display them together. We will make sure your personal book gets returned back with your pumpkin when the contest is over. Sending a copy of the book with your pumpkin is not required.
- 7. Pumpkins will be sent home November 1, 2021. Any pumpkins remaining after that date will be discarded.
- 8. The entry form and book character examples are located on the back of this letter.
