Parents and Guardians,

The **Tri-County Youth Services Bureau, Inc.** (TCYSB) School-Based Program is a program offered to provide integrated mental health services for school-aged children throughout Charles County. TCYSB school-based clinicians work with students in elementary, middle, and high school, to support students in overcoming behavioral, emotional, and social challenges that interfere with success at school and at home. TCYSB School-Based Clinicians help students reduce disruptive behavior and improve self-monitoring skills. Integrated as members of the school team, we can serve youth in a familiar setting, offering minimal interruption to their school day. Services may include individual or group therapy, family counseling, specialized training and support for parents and teachers, collaboration with community providers, and linkage to additional community resources.

This is my first year working with Tri-County Youth Services Bureau, Inc. as a school-based clinician. Upon completing my BS in Elementary Education, I began my 30-year tenure with CCPS as a 3rd grade teacher. After completing my MEd in Guidance and Counseling, I transferred to the position of professional school counselor at the elementary level and remained in that position for 16 years. I transferred to the position of Pupil Personnel Worker and was fortunate enough to be able to work with elementary, middle and high school students and families. During my 8 years as a PPW, I returned to school and obtained a MS in Studies in Human Behavior and began a PhD program. On July 1, 2019, I retired from full-time employment with Charles County Public Schools. During the 2019-2020 school year, I returned to CCPS to work part-time as a school counselor at Jenifer Elementary. At the conclusion of that year, I took a year off of work to complete my doctoral program. I received a PhD in Advance studies in Human Behavior in February, 2021.

Joining the Tri-County Youth Services Bureau, Inc. School Based Program gives me the feeling of being home again. I look forward to partnering with school staff and parents to support students in their efforts to develop the skills necessary for success at school, at home and in the community. Having previous experience working in the schools allows me to bring a unique perspective to this position.




